



We are bombarded with contradictory messages and images about how people should relate.

Many of us have come to believe that relationships are all about the domination of one partner by another.

This domination model is painful and counterproductive. Yet, we live with the consequences every day.

Destructive patterns of domestic violence and warfare are not natural behavior. Prejudice and the ongoing domination of one group by another are not necessarily inevitable conditions.

Eisler presents us with a new vision of partnership based on mutual respect and trust. She demonstrates how this can lead to greater freedom, a smaller economic gap between classes, and generally higher standard of living for everybody concerned.

And she also demonstrates how our behavior with intimate partners is linked to an expanding circle of relationships, which also affects the world at large.



She's a brilliant psychotherapist, and the wife of Boston Philharmonic conductor Benjamin Zander. Reading their book is like overhearing an important discussion between two extraordinary people. Their lighthearted dialogues reveal much deeper insights into reality.

Rosamund Stone Zander offers a truly exciting notion of the art of possibility. The life force of humankind has a passionate desire to connect, express and communicate.

When that life force is working, it sparks from one person to another, magically opening up a larger realm of possibilities.

In music, practice is the crucial element in the creation of art. In life, it is the same. Life is invention and we are the inventors of ourselves. We can always find within ourselves the source of any problem.

Zander offers thought-provoking ideas that move us from the self-centered concept of *we* (meaning "me plus you") to a larger definition of *we* (meaning "all of us together").
